imaginative connections to the music. At the same time, we bear witness as a community, and feel less alone. The Trio (Lois Shapiro, piano, Francine Trester, violin, and Julie Reimann, cello) was born out of a period of aloneness and isolation - the pandemic/quarantine of 2020-21, during which Trester and Shapiro met outdoors to play on Shapiro's porch for her neighborhood. Not long after, this little musical community expanded when Reimann and Trester reconnected online. Not having seen each other since graduate school, they reunited in part because of the virtual connections necessitated by the pandemic. Hailing from diverse professional backgrounds (medical, compositional, and performance), the three musicians are united in their aim of sharing in the spirit of Eleuthera, with a desire to give back through the gift of music. Their presentations are multidisciplinary, emphasizing process, and performances are accompanied by commentary, insight and interpretation that explain the music "from the inside out."

Described as a performer who "conjures enchantment", Lois Shapiro is a highly sought-after solo and collaborative pianist, who has performed throughout the United States and abroad and has recorded on a number of labels including Afka, Bridge, Channel Classics, and Centaur. A highly regarded teacher of both piano and chamber music, Lois has taught at Smith College, Brandeis University, the Longy School of Music, and is currently on the faculty at Wellesley College, New England Conservatory, and Rivers School Conservatory of Music. Praised for her "compelling" and "thought-provoking" work, violinist and composer Francine Trester is a professor of composition at Berklee College of Music. Her compositions have been performed nationally and internationally by acclaimed solo artists, chamber ensembles and orchestras. Francine's work is available through the American Composers Alliance and Affetto/Naxos, Albany, Crystal and Stone Records. As a violinist-composer, she attended Juilliard, Yale, and Tanglewood, and continues to maintain an active performance schedule. A graduate of Curtis Institute of Music and Stanford University (MD and PhD in Biophysics) and winner of numerous music competitions, cellist Julie Reimann has performed nationally and internationally as a soloist, chamber musician, and orchestral player. Hailed for her "brilliant virtuosity with evocative musicality", Julie performs regularly in solo recitals and as a chamber and orchestral musician, is a founding member of Duo Amie, and is a practicing dermatopathologist in the Boston area. She can be heard on Spotify, Apple Music, Amazon Music, SoundCloud, and YouTube.
