#### Covenant

### Approvals:

- · Jud moved and Laurel seconded that the March minutes be approved. Unanimous approval, motion passed.
- · By email
  - Susan sent an email on March 26 with a proposal from the UUUM delegates for the PEWS project. Four voted approval, proposal was approved.
  - o Susan sent an email on March 27 with a request from Demie to have the FUUSN bells rung for 11 minutes at 11 am on Earth Day, April 22<sup>nd</sup>, in conjunction with other faith communities. Five voted yes, proposal was approved.

### **FY24 Personnel Budget**

- The newly reconstituted PPC committee consists of John Adkins, Betty Lenmes, Lila McCain (consultant)
- · Laurel read the personnel items in budget (Susan was having connection issues.)
- The salaries reflect items that were discussed at the March Ops Council meeting
- · Overall, it is similar to last year
- Additions and deletions were reviewed
- The finance committee is looking to pass a budget with a \$50,000 deficit (now at \$64,000); some funds have been removed from B & G budget to help reach this amount.
- There is concern about the budget because the budget drive is not doing as well as hoped at this time.
- · Karen moved to accept the personnel budget, Jud seconded, unanimous approval, motion passed

#### Staff update –Devin

- 4 new members have been approved by the board, 2 more applications are going to the board
- He is having coffee and conversations this week with one potential new member, and has 3 more in next few weeks.

RE has been going well. He is gearing up for the Coming of Age service May 7 and RE Sunday June 4.

- Food at the annual meeting; the plant-based eating group has offered to prepare food. Saul Lookner expressed interest in helping doing BBQ.

#### Financial – Karen

- March
  - Pledges are coming in for this year
  - o Special building use fees are coming in and are already over budget
  - Expenses
    - § Figuring out what will actually be spent this year
    - § Utilities reduced the amount in this year's budget for electricity
    - § There are expenses in the music budget for Anne's replacements while she is on sabbatical.
  - o Looks like break even for end of year at this time
- Annual Budget Drive
  - Most recent update \$542,181 (as of April 18) goal is \$615,000

### **Update: Committee activities**

- · Minster's pictures working group proposal, including D. Golann question
  - o Laurel, Christine Lookner, Hattie, RoseAnn are the group
  - o Met on Zoom twice
  - The proposal was sent out with the agenda
  - Two sessions are booked one in person after the service on April 30, one on Zoom May 4 for people to discuss

- Would like whatever is decided to be a congregational project, especially developing material behind QR codes – needs enthusiastic volunteers
- Discussion of proposal
  - § The building has many outdated pieces of history
  - § Would be useful to have a process to remove and/or replace
  - § D. Golann had obtained a poster that he proposed hanging. Consensus was not to do anything at this time; it will be part of a larger discussion.
- B & G project updates Laurel
  - The bid for a new basement entrance was almost \$500,000, and that project is currently on hold
  - o A soils engineer will charge \$18,000 to do soil testing, to see if the entrance might be constructed at lower cost. There is enough money in the B & G budget this year to cover this.
  - She has also proposed to Pine Village that they share costs in return for reduced rent for the basement space.
  - Eric moved to approve \$18,000 for the soil testing; Karen seconded; unanimous approval, motion passed.
